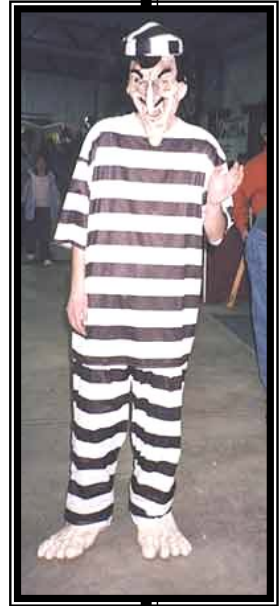

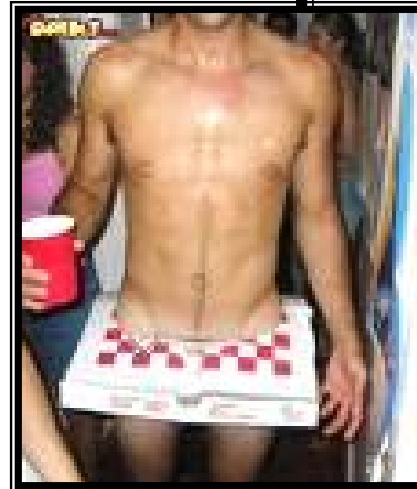

The Rotary Club of Cumberland Centennial has been supporting the Comox Valley Paramedic Volunteer Bike Team since the team was formed in 2007. On Saturday, 18 October, at the Rotary Club's Fourth Annual Extravaganza Italiana fundraiser in Cumberland, Team representatives, Ryan Thorburn and Bill Coltart accepted a second portable automated electronic defibrillator from Dodie Brand, Community Service Directory for the club.

The volunteer team participates at large and small community events, prepared to provide on-site response in the event of an incident requiring their skills. The defibrillator will be added to their inventory of equipment and will make the team more flexible and responsive if someone experiences a heart attack.
